- 5. They promote and increase awareness of their talents and abilities.
- 6. They provide a means of changing the culture, language and conversation from "disability to ability."
- 7. They exemplify life's diverse reality.
- 8. They foster possible opportunities of inclusion for actors with other disabilities.
- 9. They promote equality and facilitate accessibility.
- 10. They reduce or eliminate fear.
- 11. Their hidden stories and life experiences offer new material for theatre productions
- 12. They promote inclusion which increases acceptance in other areas of society.
